



# Call basics from the Digital Europe Programme workprogramme 2021-2022

#### Public Sector Open Data for AI:

Type of action	Simple grant (50% co-funding rate)
Indicative Budget	EUR 20 million
Indicative time of call opening	Second call
Indicative duration of the action	24-36 months
Indicative budget per Grant (EU contribution)	EUR 5-6 million
Implementation	European Commission
Security	Call restricted on the basis of article 12(6) of the Digital Europe Programme Regulation



## What are we looking for?

Increase the <u>easy availability</u>, <u>quality and usability of public sector information</u> in compliance with the requirement of the Open Data Directive, in order to boost the re-use and combination of open public data across the EU for the development of information products and services, including Al applications



## What are we looking for?

Support public administrations at local, regional and national level in increasing semantic, technical and legal interoperability and data portability of the High Value Datasets (HVDs):

- Geospatial
- Earth observation and environment
- Meteorological
- Statistics
- Companies and company ownership
- Mobility



## What are we looking for?

- Datasets generated must be discoverable and available through one or more Member States' open data portals for free
- Conditions for the publication and re-use of datasets generated by the proposed actions must be machine readable and compatible with open standard licence
- List of attributes, formats, structure, semantics, documentation, terms of use and data quality attributes to ensure cross-border interoperability
- Access through existing or, where necessary, newly developed Application Programming Interfaces (APIs)



## What we do <u>NOT</u> want?

- Datasets outside the six thematic categories mentioned in the Open data Directive and addressed by the future High Value Datasets Regulation
- Newly generated datasets, UNLESS these new datasets are the result of the merge of already existing ones, harmonized, improved in quality, etc.



## Public Sector Open Data for Al – topic evolution

Is this new or has it been called before?

Calls addressing a similar objective were included in several workprogrammes of the Connecting Europe Facility programme 2014-2020.

This call restricts the thematic categories to the ones of the Open Data Directive, and includes the obligation of making datasets available for free, through APIs and, where relevant, in bulk download



# Public Sector Open Data for Al – Key actors

Who are the types of main stakeholders that are addressed?

Public Administrations addressed by the obligations of the Open Data Directive and the upcoming Implementing Regulation on High Value Datasets.

Public and private data reusers stakeholders may be implicated in the choice of datasets to be prioritized.

An Implementing Regulation planned for 2022 will define the list of specific high-value data sets within the 6 thematic categories set out in Annex I among the documents to which the Directive applies

Datasets listed in the implementing act to be made available

- for free,
- in machine-readable formats,
- via APIs,
- as bulk downloads (where relevant).

In case of a substantial impact on the budget of the public bodies involved, free availability can be delayed by up to 2 years

### Statistics- draft Implementing Regulation

#### **Scope: Dataset categories**

- Business statistics (industrial production, industrial producer price index, production in construction, retail trade, trade in goods, tourism),
- macroeconomic statistics (consumer prices, national accounts GDP key indicators on corporations, key indicators on households, government expenditure and revenue, government debt) and
- social statistics (population, fertility, mortality, healthcare expenditure, poverty, inequality, employment, unemployment, potential labour force).

Each dataset specification also includes minimum required key variables (e.g. gross value added, final consumption, exports and imports) as well as the precise combination of breakdowns (e.g. regional (NUTS 2 or NUTS 3), sex, age, activity) to apply for each key variable.

#### **Publication modalities**

- CC-BY 4.0 licence
- CSV, XML (SDMX) and JSON formats
- Both API and bulk download
- Complete metadata and documentation according to official statistics baseline standard (SIMS)
- The requirement to use controlled vocabularies and taxonomies which are DCAT-compatible
- Higher degree of granularity for the metadata files (i.e. description of the statistical data, as well as descriptions of the statistical concepts, methodologies and information on data quality)



## Company information - draft Implementing Regulation

### Mobility - draft Implementing Regulation

- Datasets within the scope of the **INSPIRE data theme Transport Networks** as defined in Annex I to Directive 2007/2/EC. Road, rail, air and water transport networks and related infrastructure.
  - At all generalisation levels available up to a scale of 1:5000;
  - National coverage (where available);
  - Including national identification code;
  - Longitude and latitude as well as links with cross-border networks, where available.
- For those Member States to which the Directive 2005/44/EC of the European Parliament and of the
  Council of 7 September 2005 on harmonised river information services (RIS) on inland waterways
  in the Community (RIS Directive) applies, this category also includes the datasets in the table below;
  the datasets are understood as described in the RIS Directive



# Funding by the Digital Europe Programme: how to submit a proposal

- Proposals must be submitted electronically via the <u>Funding & Tenders Portal</u> Electronic Submission System
- Proposals (including annexes and supporting documents) must be submitted using the forms provided inside the Submission System
- Proposals must be complete:
  - Application Form Part A contains administrative information and the summarised budget for the project
  - Application Form Part B contains the technical description of the project (Max. 70 pages -Evaluators will not consider any additional pages.)
  - Mandatory annexes and supporting documents



# Who can participate

- legal entities (public or private bodies)
- established in one of the eligible countries, i.e.:
  - EU Member States (including overseas countries and territories)
  - EEA countries
  - countries associated to the Digital Europe Programme or countries which are in ongoing negotiations for an association agreement and where the agreement enters into force before grant signature (Turkey, Serbia, Moldova, Ukraine, Israel)
- participation in any capacity (as beneficiary, affiliated entity, associated partner, subcontractor or recipient of financial support to third parties) is limited to entities from eligible countries



# Who can participate

- Natural persons are NOT eligible (with the exception of self- employed persons established in one of the eligible countries)
- International organisations are not eligible, unless they are International organisations of European Interest within the meaning of Article 2 of the Digital Europe Regulation (i.e. international organisations the majority of whose members are Member States or whose headquarters are in a Member State)
- EU bodies EU bodies (with the exception of the European Commission Joint Research Centre) can NOT be part of the consortium.
- all topics of this call are subject to restrictions due to security, therefore entities must not be directly or indirectly controlled from a country that is not an eligible country.
- All entities have to fill in and submit a declaration on ownership and control,
   except for entities that are validated as public bodies by the Central Validation Service



# Consortium composition and applicable rules

- minimum 3 applicants (beneficiaries; not affiliated entities)
- at least one applicant is a public sector body in the scope of the Open Data Directive
- Projects should take into account the results of projects supported by other EU funding programmes. The complementarities must be described in the project proposals
- The proposals must relate to activities taking place in the eligible countries
- Projects must comply with:
  - highest ethical standards and
  - applicable EU, international and national law (including the General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679).
- Proposals under this call for proposals will have to undergo an ethics review to authorise funding and may be subject to specific ethics rules



## What is funded and how much

- The grant will be a budget-based mixed actual cost grant (<u>actual costs</u>, with unit cost and flat-rate elements). This means that it will reimburse ONLY certain types of costs (<u>eligible costs</u>) and costs that were actually incurred for your project (NOT the budgeted costs).
- The costs will be reimbursed at the funding rate fixed in the Grant Agreement: **50%**
- Grants may NOT produce a profit (i.e. surplus of revenues + EU grant over costs). For-profit organisations must declare their revenues and, if there is a profit, we will deduct it from the final grant amount

# Eligible costs

- Personnel costs
  - Employees, natural persons under direct contract, seconded persons
  - SME owners and natural person beneficiaries
- Subcontracting costs
- Purchase costs
  - Travel and subsistence
  - Equipment (depreciation only, NO full cost for equipment)
- Indirect cost flat-rate: 7% of the eligible direct costs
- Other costs (e.g. project websites: communication costs for presenting the project on the participants' websites or social media accounts are eligible; costs for separate project websites are not eligible)



## Payment arrangements

- After grant signature, you will normally receive a prefinancing to start working on the project (normally 50% of the maximum grant amount; exceptionally less or no prefinancing).
- There will be one or more interim payments.
- At the end of the project, we will calculate your final grant amount. If the total of earlier payments is higher than the final grant amount, we will ask you (your coordinator) to pay back the difference (recovery).
- All payments will be made to the coordinator.



## **Evaluation**

• An evaluation committee (composed or assisted by independent outside experts) will assess all applications. Proposals will first be checked for formal requirements (admissibility, and eligibility). Proposals found admissible and eligible will be evaluated against the <u>award criteria</u> and then ranked according to their scores.

## Evaluation

#### Relevance

- Alignment with the objectives and activities as described in section 2
- Contribution to long-term policy objectives, relevant policies and strategies, and synergies with activities at European and national level

### **Implementation**


- Maturity of the project
- Soundness of the implementation plan and efficient use of resources
- Capacity of the applicants, and when applicable the consortium as a whole, to carry out the proposed work

### **Impact**

- Extent to which the project will achieve the expected outcomes and deliverables referred to in the call for proposals and, where relevant, the plans to disseminate and communicate project achievements
- Extent to which the project will strengthen competitiveness and bring important benefits for society
